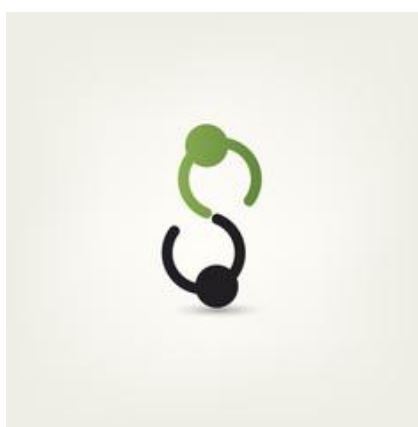


Coaching Ethics & Supervision, 10.06.2027, 09:30-16:30 (online), £150

What ethical considerations do I and others need to have regard to in practice as a coach or coaching psychologist? How can supervision support coaching practice? How can I effectively engage in, and/or provide, coaching supervision?



This workshop aims to support coaches and/or coaching psychologists to explore important ethical considerations that guide the provision of coaching and coaching psychology services. Given the important role of supervision in supporting the ethical delivery of coaching/coaching psychology practice, the session is also aimed at coaches/coaching psychologists who would like to experience/enhance the benefit they can gain from engaging in coaching supervision themselves, and for those who are either providing or seeking to provide supervision to other coaches or coaching psychologists.

The session will cover:

- Ethical considerations in coaching and coaching psychology practice.
- Using a structured approach to work through real-life examples of ethical issues.
- What is supervision?
- Different types of supervision.
- A framework for providing (or, indeed, receiving) coaching supervision conversations.
- Supporting others to reflect on, and extract learning and development points from, their coaching practice.
- The opportunity to experience supervision, provide others with supervision and practice supervision skills.
- Practical resources to support the provision and facilitation of coaching supervision relationships.
